At a minimum we suggest that you cancel any events planned between now and the end of the Convention blackout period, which would have run through August 6, 2020.

He graduated from Southport High School in 1933. He met Margaret whom he married in 1937. They had two children, a son and a daughter. Don decided he needed a full-time job that was year-round, unlike his father's construction job that did not have much work during the winter months.

He decided to go into retail sales which led him to L.S. Ayres. He was the manager of the southeast section of the downtown store and traveled to the other LS Ayres stores when they opened in other areas of Indiana. After leaving L.S. Ayres he went to Wilking Music Company. He plays the piano and admits that reading music is a challenge but loves to play by ear. To this day, he sings in the church choir and plays the piano for enjoyment. Music is very much a part of his life.

Don's dad was a Master Mason at Southport Lodge where Don followed him in Masonry and has been a member for more than 75 years. He claims that he is the luckiest man because of his affiliation with the Masons which allowed him to live in what he calls his "Five-Star" Hotel, Compass Park, where he can eat at tables with white tablecloths and order off the menu if he chooses.


Sitting and talking with these two people is a trip through years of experiences and a witness of true love for their cars. Being a small part of this has been a joy.
